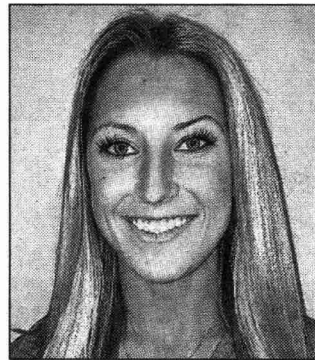


# Peak Physical Therapy announces new Scituate High School athletic trainer
